

Camping in National Parks

The National Parks and Wildlife Service has various plans and rules for camping in the National Parks of NSW. The Clubs are free to use the parks but they have no preference over the public.

It is necessary to find out the system for each park that a person intends to camp in. This can be done in several ways

- National Parks visitor centre
- Information Centre
- Call the NPWS Customer Experience Team on 1300 072 757, they are available 7 days per week
- Call the Environment Line 1300 361 967, they are available on week days only,
- Go to the web site [www.environment and heritage](http://www.environmentandheritage.org.au) which can also be searched with "oeh". On that site the blue banner on top has sections on it, "home", "Environmental Issues", "Climate Change", etc. and select "Visiting a park". When the cursor is held over this tab a drop down menu will give options, click on "find parks and attractions" then click on "the orange "search by region" and click on the blue "clickable map". A map will come up and then click on the area and another map will come up of that area and on the right hand side a list of the national parks in that region. Click on the National Park that is of interest and that will give the Rules of camping in that national park.
- Go to [www.national parks and wildlife service](http://www.nationalparksandwildlife.gov.au) which can also be found by searching "npws". And navigate to the national park.
